

# **COURSE: SPANISH CONVERSATION II**

# **Course description**

This is directed to the students who are interested in developing their resources and strategies to communicate adequately in Daily contexts. Its objective is to contribute to produce a fluent and natural discourse in Spanish which promotes interaction and the use of strategies in expression and oral comprehension which are adequate to different situations.

## Methodology

A highly practical course. In each session, functional language and vocabulary will be presented and then practised in conversations in pairs and groups.



#### **Assessment**

Attendance and participation in class: 40%

Mid-term oral exam: 30%

Final oral exam: 30%

Both oral fluency and pronunciation will be taken into account, as well as appropriate register and language skills for this level.
