

COURSE: ART IN SPAIN: FROM THE MEZQUITA OF CORDOBA AND THE CATHEDRAL OF SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA TO GAUDÍ, PICASSO AND DALÍ I

Course description

The aim of this course is to provide an overview of the main expressions of art in the Iberian Peninsula, from its origins to the present day. We will study major monuments such as Romanesque churches, gothic cathedrals or *modernista* buildings, as well as the main painters and sculptors, including El Greco, Velázquez, Murillo, Goya, Picasso or Dalí.

Methodology

Each session will include a presentation of the topic based on a *power point*. Students will be expected to participate actively.

The class will be complemented by visits to the city's main monuments and museums.

Assessment system

- Renaissance sculpture and painting.
- El Greco.
- The golden age of Spanish art: architecture and the Baroque imaginary.
- The great Baroque painters: Ribera, Zurbarán, Velázquez, Murillo.



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
